Wright State University is a national public university in Dayton, Ohio with more than 13,000 students. Assistant Professor, Tenure Track Rehabilitation Counseling

Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio is pleased to announce a tenure track position for an assistant professor in rehabilitation counseling. Serve as both program director and faculty advisor for students in the undergraduate Rehabilitation Services major and minor.

Essential Functions:

1. Teach undergraduate and graduate rehabilitation courses and provide clinical supervision in rehabilitation counseling.
2. Advise undergraduate's students in the Rehabilitation Services program.
3. Serve as program director for the Rehabilitation Services program, revise curriculum as needed to meet changing needs of the profession, and assist in the delivery of the College of Education and Human Services Unit Assessment Plan.
4. Serve on Department, College, and University Committees as appropriate.
5. Develop a research agenda in rehabilitation counseling that leads to regular publications in refereed professional journals, books, or book chapters. Applicants are also expected to pursue appropriate extramural funding opportunities.

Required Qualifications:

1. Doctorate in rehabilitation counseling or closely related field anticipated by the start date from CACREP or CORE accredited program
2. Counseling experience working with people with disabilities.
3. Prior teaching experience at the college level and prior mentoring undergraduate and graduate students.
4. Eligible to acquire Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC), must complete within one year.

Working Conditions
